Disbursements will begin on May 1, 2020.

Students must have met the following criteria for the Spring 2020 semester

- Completed a 2020-2020 FAFSA
- Must not be on Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Suspension
- Must not be in default on a student loan

1. Log into myCCC, click the "Students" tab.

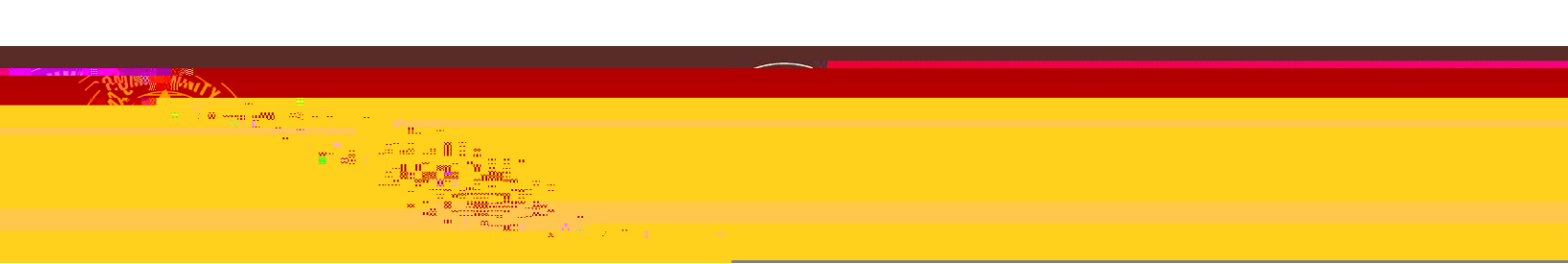
2. Select the "My Financial Aid" tab.

3. Select the "Financial Aid Awards" tab.

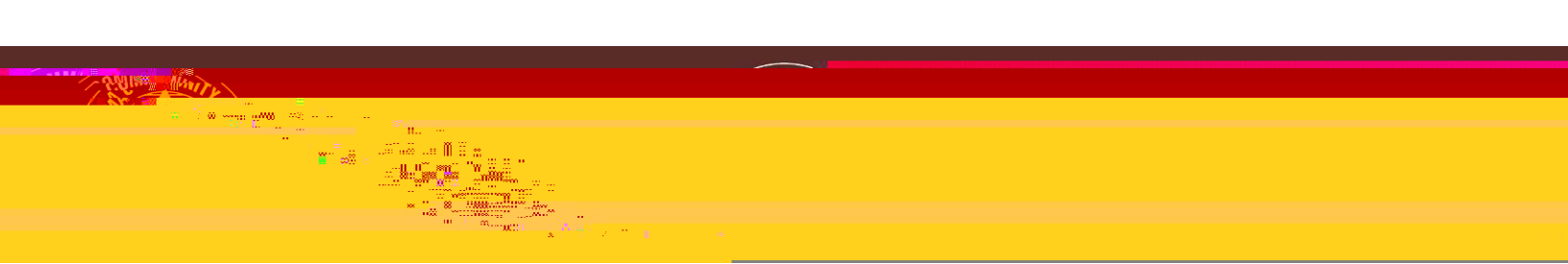
4. Be sure to select the "2020 - 2020" Award Year to see the award description and amount.

Students may apply for a COVID- Emergency Assistance Grant by submitting to the Office of Student Financial Aid. Applicants who have not already submitted a 0 - 0 0 FAFSA form must also submit a FAFSA form by July to verify Title IV eligibility. The CCC Financial Aid Office may require additional information or documentation to support a student's application. COVID- Emergency Assistance Grants are not renewable. Award amounts will be determined based on a student's eligibility and circumstances but will not exceed 00 per application.

### **Phase 3 – Distribute Remainder**

If funds remain after decisions have been made on all timely and properly filed COVID- Emergency Assistance Grant applications, CCC will distribute the remaining funds in a manner similar to the immediate assistance grant process outlined above. The exact parameters for eligibility and distribution of such funds will be determined at a later date if necessary. The cumulative amount of all distributions to a student under the three phases of this process shall not exceed

In alignment with recommendations from the Department of Education, Coahoma Community College will distribute CARES Act funds to all currently enrolled Title IV eligible students who have no option but to enroll in online classes due to the campus response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Disbursements will begin on July 1, 2020.

- Completed a minimum of 6 credit hours in the previous semester (A+ to A)
- Completed a CARES Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Application by July 1, 2020
- - must be currently enrolled
- - must not be on Satisfactory Academic Progress /S.A.P. Suspension
- - must not be in (c) 0.996094 (t) 4.0429A225 (/) 4.10156 (S) 3.59375 (A)
